Whole-class teaching

Bug Club Phonics was also analysed as part of the Bug Club UCL Institute of Education (IOE) randomised control trial which showed pupils were 11 months ahead of their expected age equivalent reading score after 5 terms of use, as measured against Cambridge University Press and Assessment's InCAS standardised reading assessment. One of the key pupil outcomes highlighted in the trial was the increase in 'positive pupil behaviours toward reading, including enjoyment, engagement and independence'.

There's plenty of phonics screening check preparation and materials to help your cohorts feel at ease with the check so your school can feel confident that your pupils will apply their decoding knowledge and be ready for the next step in their reading journey.
