CELEBRATING MORE SUCCESS

In the last edition of Swallownest Sunshine, we celebrated the successes of all of our learners at each key assessment point across school. This time we can celebrate the successes of our children who the government deem to be disadvantaged.

- EYFS 67% of disadvantaged children achieved a Good Level of Development (GLD)
- Year 1 88% of disadvantaged children successfully passed their phonics screen check
- Year 4 50% of disadvantaged children scored 25 / 25 on their Maths Multiplication Check
- Year 6 71% of disadvantaged children achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined.
- Year 6 100% of disadvantaged children achieved the expected standard in writing and maths.

Another incredible set of results which highlight our commitment to providing the best opportunities for all of our children across school.

WIDER EXPERIENCES

Last week, Mexico Class visited Crucial Crew where they took part in a variety of life-skills workshops designed to educate and keep them safe. These included workshops on knife crime, water safety, road safety and even included a mock trial in the magistrates court.
